The Associate in Fine Arts in Music to Bachelor of Music Articulation Agreement is an agreement jointlycreated by the NCCOS sociate in Fine Arts (AFA) Music programs and the signatory NCICB achelorof Musicprograms. The AFA in Musico Bachelorof Musicis focused on facilitating transfer for students who begin musics tudies at a community college and then transfer toone of the signatory NCIC programs. There are nultiple Bachelorof Music granting institutions within the NCICU whose focus on music While the individual names of these Bachelorof Music grees may vary slight between NCICU programs, for the sake of consistency and clarity we will refer to all four-year music degrees as Bachelor of Music within this document. Thespecificitile of each degree will be listed in Appendix A, under Participating Programs.

Transfer of Courses not originated at North Carolina community colleges Transfer courses that onot originate in a North Carolina Community Collegeor signatory NCIC lastitution may be used under the AFA in Music Bachelorof Music with the following stipulations:

- a. Coursesmustbe completed a regionally accredited institution of higher education;
- b. Coursesmustmeet general education equirements; and
- c. Coursesmay totalno more than14 hoursof general education course credit.

<u>Guiding Principle</u>: If a student from a North Carolina Commur@gllege System (NCCCS) college believes the terms of the FAin Musicto Bachelorof MusicArticulation Agreementhave not been honored by æignatory NCICId stitution to which the student has been admitted, the student may invoke the AFAin Musicto Bachelor of MusicArticulation AgreementTransfer Credit Appeal Procedure.

#### Steps in Filing an Appeal

#### Step #1:

No later than the last day of dasses of the first semester for which admission is offered, the student must submit a ransfer Credit Appeal Form along with supporting documentation to the MusicChair/Executive(or other campus design@at the signatory NCICbampus to which the student has been admitted Students first enrolling at the senior institution insammer session must submit their appeal by the end of **stub** sequent fall semester.

The student must specify on the appeal form the specific AFA in Music to Bachelor of Music Articulation Agreement language that is in contention. Appeals that lack this information will not be considered.
